Parish Pastoral Councils/Assemblies

Parish Pastoral Councils/Assemblies are "a faith-filled leadership group through which priests and people work together as co-responsible partners in furthering the mission of Christ in their own parish." (Living Communion, Irish Catholic Bishops' Conference)

We are very pleased to offer formation/training to new Pastoral Councils/Assemblies (PPC/A) and those already in existence this autumn. We are offering three 2-hour evening sessions **from mid-October onwards**. These sessions will focus on the purpose, structure and mission of the PPC/A (including membership and representation, roles, working groups, and practical skills). PPC/A will be provided with a training support pack containing helpful resources, templates and tools. It enables young people to become more aware of the teaching and role of the Catholic Church in the world and to engage at a deep level with Christ. The Award was created to commemorate the late Pope Saint John Paul II who was so committed to young people and who had such

belief and confidence in them.

- The Award is for anyone from the age of 16 18 inclusive: in 4th, 5th or 6th year, or not in post-primary education.
- The Award is non-competitive, flexible and voluntary and requires an ongoing commitment.
